hen her brother moved out of his college dorm and into his own apartment, Mira Pandya starting asking her parents when she could have her own apartment. Both Vidyut and Magda Pandya knew the time had come to start looking at the different options that were available. Mira was



a student at Jefferson High School when her parents started working with Access Services, they were surprised when after just a few months they heard from 2 agencies who had openings. The Pandyas decided to look at both and weighed each option carefully. They decided on MILESTONE for a number of reasons. They liked the level of family involvement and how each individual was responsible for helping keep their room in order and helped with things like the weekly shopping. By the time the required paperwork was completed Mira was 18 and could move into an Adult Group Home. Her parents say she adjusted with ease and

credit several things including the fact she knew one of her house mates from Camp Sunshine. Mira graduated from Jefferson High School in 1991 and started working at Growth Enterprises. A few years after MILESTONE Industries was opened, she changed jobs and started working at MILESTONE

Industries. She says she



loves the variety of jobs at MILESTONE Industries and the fact she has learned how to use a computer. About 10 years ago Mira moved to a different MILESTONE Group Home and her parents say she has grown tremendously and has become more self sufficient and independent. They know someone from MILESTONE will always be there to help Mira and that has given them peace of mind. They also



like the fact MILESTONE has given their daughter a chance to participate in community events and quickly add she loves being involved in Special Olympics, being a member of the MILESTONE Dancers and going on community outings. While Mira agrees, she also quickly adds that two of her favorite things are being an Aunt to her older brother's daughter, and traveling with her family. Both

her parents enjoy being involved with MILESTONE. Her mother has served on the Human Rights Committee, which reviews the behavior development programs for the individuals, helped



with the decorating of the homes and volunteered whenever there is a need. Her parents also say they really enjoy going to Mira's house for the annual holiday dinner for

parents and guardians. While the decision to start looking at different places for their daughter was not easy, they are glad MILESTONE was there to meet their needs.

athletes braved the cold and snow and headed to Galena for The Illinois State Winter Special Olympic games. The temperature at Chestnut Mountain may have been below









TIME CAPSULE OPENED MARKING THE START OF ROCVALE'S SECOND 100 YEARS.





ILESTONE'S RocVale Children's Home marked the beginning of its second Century of Caring by removing and opening a time capsule placed in the Rockford Children's Home in 1924.

Jim Hamilton, President and CEO of MILESTONE and Perry Sabet, Suburban Chicago architect and owner of the Pioneer building removed the time capsule from the cornerstone and opened it. The following items were found in the 1924 time capsule:





- Brochures used in the Capital Campaign for the Children's Home
- A copy of the Children's Home By-Laws and Charter
- Photos from the 1920 Groundbreaking ceremony
- Newspaper articles about the opening of the new facility
- A list of Board Members
- A list of donors





An envelope containing the following was collected for a new time capsule :

- Artwork created by the residents of RocVale
- A copy of the Blueprints of the present Children's Home
- A photograph of a group of residents
- A History of the Rockford Children's Home/RocVale
- A copy of the Rockford Register Star article on the Children's Home 100th anniversary





The items removed from the original time capsule were on display at Midway Village and Museum Center so people could see them first hand. All three area television stations and the Rockford Register Star covered the time capsule opening.





The Rockford Children's home opened its doors in 1906 and moved to the Longwood location in the 1920s. In 1970 ground was broken for the current location on North Rockton Ave. In 1975 the name was changed to RocVale. In 2001 RocVale merged with MILESTONE, Inc.

ANOTHER PHASE OF NO-LIFT PROGRAM COMPLETE

nother phase of the No-Lift program at MILESTONE'S Elmwood Heights facility has been completed. A grant from the Rockford Memorial Development Foundation was used to purchase repositioning equipment. The Versaforms and Love Sacs will provide proper body alignment for longer periods of time, and allow individuals to be in the



commons areas for longer periods without compromising their care. The new equipment also reduces the number of times during a shift that a staff member needs to lift an individual to reposition them.

AMCORE FOUNDATION AND WILLIAM MILLER TRUST AWARD GRANTS

oth the Amcore Foundation and the William Miller Trust awarded grants to MILESTONE to



assist in the purchasing of the CARE TRAK System for Elmwood Heights, Elmwood East and the MILESTONE Training Center. The CARE TRAK system is an electronic care documentation system that will provide instant access to information about the individuals and their care plan to the staff at all three facilities. We are continuing to work with other foundations to secure the remaining funding needed for the program.

THANK YOU TO AN AREA **FOUNDATION FOR THE NEW** WHEELCHAIR VAN.

A private foundation provided the funding for a new wheelchair accessible van for MILESTONE, which was put to use the day it was delivered transporting individuals from Elmwood Heights to the MILESTONE Training Center.



ALPINE KIWANIS SUPPORT MTC

Alpine Kiwanis members continue to support the MILESTONE Training Center through donations. In January the group presented a check to be used to upgrade the TV's



and DVD players used for training in the classrooms. In the past Alpine Kiwanis members have supported the Adopt A Camper program for the individuals at MTC and provided a grant for the facilities new handicapped accessible swing set.

ROCVALE HOMES GET NEW COMMUNICATION DEVICES

A grant from the Village of Machesney Park provided the funding for 5 GO TALK Communication devices for RocVale Children's Home, meeting the need of one for each home.

The GO TALK Communication Devices will help the children express their needs and wants to staff quickly through pictures and pre recorded messages. The GO TALK devices also help encourage the development of positive behavioral and socialization skills.

ASK A DENTIST



Dear Dr. Jay,

My dentist says I need a root canal, what is that?

Right from the pages of the American Dental Association website is the answer to your


question, hope this helps clear up your confusion. "Once upon a time, if you had a tooth with a diseased nerve, you'd probably lose that tooth. Today, with a special dental procedure called a root canal therapy you may save that tooth. Inside each tooth is the pulp which provides nutrients and nerves to the tooth, it runs like a thread down through the root. When the pulp is diseased or injured, the pulp tissue dies. If you don't remove it, your tooth gets infected and you could lose it. After the dentist removes the pulp, the root canal is cleaned and sealed off to protect it. Then your dentist places a crown over the tooth to help make it stronger.

Most of the time, a root canal is a relatively simple procedure with little or no discomfort involving one to three visits. Best of all, it can save your tooth and your smile!"— Jason M. Grinter, D.D.S.
